

The guest speaker for our meeting this week was Ron Bellchambers.

Ron has lived in the Brown Hill Creek area for 31 years. Now a retired school teacher, Ron has been a full time Community Volunteer for 10 years. He is the Community Engagement and Project

Officer for the Brown Hill Creek Association (www.brownhillcreek.org). Ron has partnered with the Rotary Club of Brownhill Creek on projects, is actively involved with the Kaurna community, the Friends of Brown Hill Creek, Mitcham Historical Society and Community Alliance SA.

Ron spoke about many of the projects that he has instigated, including setting up workshops, community campaigns and working with students.

There are 4 kilometres of Brown Hill Creek that he and many residents, school children, Kaurna people and all those who care about the area....look after.

A special project for Ron was to protect a Kaurna Shelter...a 450 year old tree..... which is believed to be a Birthing Tree.

Over the years, Ron has worked with 300 students from five different local schools. The Urrbrae students help younger children with the revegetation and with habitat restoration.

Some of the other projects Ron has introduced have been:

- Interpretive signage...which tells the story of the Kaurna community.
- The Green Army project which has enabled unemployed youth to gain permanent employment
- The Southern Brown Bandicoot project
- · Aquatic Ecology project
- · Seeds...planting a nature garden
- · Yam patch for bush tucker and
- Encouraging groups to take on a small patch to maintain.

Ron's knowledge of the area...the trees, the plants, the native animals and the Kaurna people....gave us more insight into the beautiful area of Brown Hill Creek.
