## What do the Friends do?

- Through well planned working bees we undertake maintenance and restoration of the native plant species along the creek and in the Park
- We develop and maintain a safe habitat for the endangered Southern Brown Bandicoot
- We look after the threatened remnant Grey Box grassy woodland that is part of the Park
- We work with school and company groups to prepare new planting sites and encourage others to adopt special areas to maintain and watch rejuvenation of the local, native plants
- The Friends value the Natural and Cultural Heritage that is part of the Park we encourage the preservation and restoration of this Heritage through local and State organisations
- We help maintain the Wirraparinga Walking Trail (part of the Yurrebilla Trail) and the Shared Use
   Trail for walkers, bikes and horses through the length of the Park
- We assist with KESAB Clean Up Australia Day to remove rubbish from the Park
- Members have access to free Certified Training in Bush Regeneration, use of power equipment for plant maintenance, safe herbicide handling and first aid.
